

Vessel Security Policy Statement

It is the policy of the company to provide a secure working environment, by establishing and maintaining the required security measures to prevent unlawful acts against vessels, which endanger the safety and security of persons and property on board company vessels. Company objectives are to:

Provide security procedures and practices for key shipboard operations by:


- Cargo handling/securing/storing.
- Navigation in open/confined waters.
- Approaching of ports / berthing / leaving port.
- Maintenance work.
- Establish safeguards to reduce risk to crew and port personnel on board company vessels.
- Improve the security skills and awareness of company personnel ashore and onboard.
- Prepare contingency measures for emergencies relating to possible security incidents.

These objectives will be achieved by:

- A Ship Security Assessment and a Ship Security Plan specific to each individual vessel.
- Comprehensive training for company personnel.
- Actively promoting security awareness amongst company personnel.
- Regular documented reviews and internal audits of security procedures and plans, in order to allow for constant update and improvement of the plan.
- All employees are expected to comply with the required procedures within the ship security plan and should be familiar with the relevant security duties required of them and the measures required for protecting the vessel from any unlawful act

Developing the SSP in consideration of:

- ISPS Code Part B 8.1 – 13.8;
- Regulation (EC) no. 725/2004
- The Company ensures that the Company Security Officer and the Ship Security Officer are given the necessary support to fulfil their duties and responsibilities in accordance with XI-2 of the 1974 SOLAS Convention, Flag requirements and other relevant regulations.
